SAILORS' MEETING – 10th MARCH

The Spring "Boatowners' Meeting" will be held in the Clubhouse at 20.00 hours (that's 8.00 p.m. for those new to sailing!), and as usual ALL sailors are welcome, not just those who actually own boats! Dinghy sailing in two-person boats is all about teamwork, and the crew is just as essential to success as the helm. There are, of course, many Junior sailors where Dad (or Mum!) is the actual owner of the boat, but this meeting needs input from all who will be actually out on the water during 2004.

The aim is to "kick-start" the sailing season, to try to drum up enthusiasm in each Class to get out there and enjoy the waters of Dublin Bay for as much of the season as possible. This year, as well as the customary schedule of Sunday morning and Wednesday evening sailing, there will be training for adult sailors on Monday evenings in May and June – depending on the success of the initial months, this may be continued throughout the season.

The 2003 Club Handbook is almost ready for printing, and will be sent out to all members within the next few weeks – it will provide the full Sailing Calendar for the Club activities. In addition, it will provide details of Regattas and other Open Events in other Clubs which may be of interest to our sailors in the GP 14, IDRA 14, 420, Laser, Mirror, and Optimist classes.

Apart from Club racing and training, the Club will be hosting several large Open events in 2004. July will be a busy month, with the **Annual Regatta** (for both Junior and Senior classes) on **Sunday 4th**; an **Open Day** on Sunday 17th in conjunction with the **Howth-Sutton Festival**; and the **Crosbie Cup** for the Optimist Class on the weekend of 24th and 25th. The annual **"Cruise-in" Barbecue** will be on **Sunday 5th September**, and the **Inter-Schools Team** racing on 2nd and 3rd of October.

SCHOOLS AND SAILING

SDC Commodore **Muriel O'Tiarnaigh**, a long-time supporter of promoting sailing as a sport for schoolchildren, attended the recent inauguration of the **Schools Sailing Association of Ireland** at a meeting in the Montague Hotel in Portlaoise. Teachers and parents from schools in the West, East and South attended. The object of the Association is to encourage and organise sailing and windsurfing competition between secondary schools (initially). The immediate work programme will be focussed on:

- Deciding on a format for regional and National Racing
- Developing a competition format/ programme for 2004/05 school year
- Looking at support structure and organisation of SSAI
