## **WHEN YOU'RE IN A HOLE .....**

If you have been up at the Club in recent weeks, you will have noticed a large hole has been dug parallel to the south-east wall of the Boat Park. This is the start of the construction work on the extension to our boat and car parking facilities (see next page for sketch of the development).

Unfortunately, it had not been possible to begin work earlier in the year, so this will have an adverse effect on the amount of space available for boat parking during the busy part of the 2006 sailing season. The contractors have to place their site buildings on the existing Boat Park, and heavy machinery will be making its way across it to work on the new sea walls.

Because of this, the Committee urges everyone to recognise that this disruption will lead to greatly improved facilities for all our members in the long term. We cannot provide boat parking places for everyone while the work is going on, so priority is being given to those who are ACTIVELY PARTICIPATING in Club sailing, and to those taking part in the Junior Training courses.

Once the work is complete, before the end of Summer, there will be enough space for all of the members' boats - even those who have had to limit their Club sailing to one month per year in the past. The Club sailing calendar carries on through the September Series, and the Frostbites in October - and on into November if you are still keen! So there will be plenty of time to enjoy your sailing!

## **TOUGH WORK FOR GP 14 SAILORS**

Visiting sailors arrived early at Sutton this year - the Club hosted the Purcell Trophy for the GP 14 Class on 20/21<sup>st</sup> May. The weather forecast for that weekend was bad, so many potential competitors stayed at home - but the 20 boats which did compete had a tiring but fruitful event, thanks to the large team of Sutton volunteers who made sure they were welcomed, fed, launched, well raced, and safely pulled ashore!

The three scheduled Saturday races went ahead as planned, testing the sailing (and for some, swimming!) skills of the competitors. Unfortunately, conditions on Sunday proved too severe, so the remaining races were cancelled. Top prize went to Niall Henry and Ossian Geraghty of Sligo Yacht Club Best of the Sutton sailors was Ruan O'Tiarnaigh sailing with John Todd (SDC/RNIYC) in 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Stephen Boyle and Nigel Tierney were 10<sup>th</sup>, with Hugh Gill and Stuart Boyle 17<sup>th</sup> (gear failure in the first race meant losing the remaining ones).

Yet another Boyle ("Big Daddy" Padraig), sailing with Mairead O'Hanlon, capsized before even getting to the first starting line, and decided to come ashore to launch an additional rescue boat. Having seen the conditions at first hand, he generously gave up his race ambitions to provide additional rescue cover for our visitors!


The Sutton GP 14 fleet have been in action for a while this year, even if they weren't in evidence in Sutton Creek - they were competing in the 2006 Spring Series in Swords Sailing & Boating Club. Hugh Gill and Stuart Boyle brought back first prize overall.

## **EXTENDING THE CLUB FACILITIES**

The new developments at Sutton Dinghy Club have been so long in the planning stages, and gone through so many adjustments, that some older members have forgotten what exactly is being done ... and some new members aren't sure either!

So to refresh your memories, and make sense of the work going on, the diagram below shows what is being built. Basically, the present Boat Park is being extended in an "L-shaped" development which extends **10 metres to the south-east** (towards the Martello Tower) and **11 metres to the south-west** (towards Dublin City).

This will provide approximately 750 m<sup>2</sup> of additional hard surface, including space for overflow car parking. The building work is being carried out by a local company - GRC Construction Ltd of Strand Road, Baldoyle. Members are reminded that safety on building sites is paramount – under no circumstances should you enter the fenced-off areas. If you want to see what's going on, just go look from the road or the car park.



## **MANY HANDS MAKE MIRROR WORK**

Our Club hosts open events every year, which attract visiting sailors from all around the country. 2006 will bring the Irish Mirror fleet to Sutton for their **Eastern Championships** over the weekend of **15/16 July**.

*This will be a particularly prestigious event for us, because the Mirror Class is still very popular with young sailors, and the numbers attending are expected to be considerable. We will be calling on all members to help make this event a success, both ashore and afloat. To make room for the visiting boats, all non-competing Club sailors will have to bring their boats home (or to a friend's garden!) on Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> July.*

Sailing Secretary **Wendy Rudd** (mobile no. **087 279 9488**) is the Club co-ordinator for the event – she will be seeking willing workers to manage traffic, register competitors, prepare food, man rescue boats, and do lots more! Our Mirror sailors have been keeping Sutton Dinghy Club's name to the fore this year: **Alan Blay** and **Cian Hickey** are second in the Mirror Class national rankings, having taken 6<sup>th</sup> place in the Spring Trophy in the NYC in March, 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Western Championships in Mullingar and 1<sup>st</sup> place in the Northern Championships in RNIYC, both in April. **Gerard O'Sullivan** and **Eoin Hickey** are close behind, fourth in the national rankings, with 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Spring Trophy, 13<sup>th</sup> in the Westerns, and 4<sup>th</sup> in the Northerns - well done to all!
