2003 – SPECIAL OLYMPICS YEAR

Everyone knows that the Special Olympic Games will be held in Dublin, with competitions in various sports being held during the week 20th – 29th June. However, you may not be aware that sailing will be part of the competition, with the Royal St. George Yacht Club hosting these events.

The sailing Games start with boat familiarisation on Sunday 22nd June, divisioning on Monday, followed by the event proper with prize giving on Friday 27th on the Plaza beside the Stena Link terminal. They hope to have about 100 athletes from many countries - applications are still being received. The George will be using Fireflies and Squibs for the event. The breakdown of the fleet will become more obvious once they have established the skill levels of the athletes.

The goal is to meet the challenge of the games:

"To provide in Ireland a unique and unparalleled sporting and cultural experience for the athletes taking part, from 160 international delegations all over the world, as well as for their coaches, families, volunteers and sponsors, combining the excitement of sport with the opportunity for personal distinction, achievement and pride".

These athletes will be supported by their parents, friends and coaches, "Ireland of the welcomes" will be on show – **see inside for details on how YOU as a member of Sutton Dinghy Club can support this event, helping to sponsor a competitor!**

SPECIAL OLYMPICS – DETAILS

Sailing will take place between the 22nd and 17th June in Dun Laoghaire harbour, and all of the local and national agencies are rowing in behind this event with great vigour to ensure the harbour is fully available and looking its best.

Viewing stands will be erected on the marina breakwater, and the Royal St. George Yacht Club intend having a commentator available to ensure it is a real spectacle.

Many may remember the glorious week a few years ago when the George hosted the World Team Racing National Championships – they hope to replicate the joy of that event in their Club this year.

Apart from sailing, the Special Olympics World Summer Games 2003 will include Aquatics, Athletics, Badminton, Basketball, Bocce, Bowling, Cycling, Equestrian, Football, Golf, Gymnastics, Powerlifting, Roller-skating, Table Tennis, Tennis, Team Handball and Volleyball.

There will also be three demonstration sports offered, Kayaking, Judo and Pitch & Putt.

SAILORS' MEETING – 18TH FEB

The Spring “Boatowners’ Meeting” will be held in the Clubhouse at 20.30 hours (that’s 8.30 p.m. for those new to sailing!), and as usual ALL sailors are welcome, not just those who actually own boats! Dinghy sailing in two-person boats is all about teamwork, and the crew is just as essential to success as the helm. There are, of course, many Junior sailors where Dad (or Mum!) is the actual owner of the boat, but this meeting needs input from all who will be actually out on the water during 2003.

The aim is to “kick-start” the sailing season, to try to drum up enthusiasm in each Class to get out there and enjoy the waters of Dublin Bay for as much of the season as possible. This year, with the new sewage treatment plant in Ringsend coming on stream, these waters should be cleaner than ever – all we need now is fair winds and sunny weather!

The 2003 Club Handbook is almost ready for printing, and will be sent out to all members within the next few weeks – it will provide the full Sailing Calendar for the Club activities. In addition, it will provide details of Regattas and other Open Events in other Clubs which may be of interest to our sailors in the GP 14, IDRA 14, 420, Laser, Mirror, and Optimist classes.

NEW KITCHEN NEWS

Recent times have seen a campaign to raise funds for a new kitchen for the Club: a campaign which was very successful, so now it’s time to put the money where our mouths hope to be – on the means to produce good food in proper hygienic conditions!

The designs have been finalised, tenders have been obtained, and contracts are being signed – all going well, the new facilities will be in place by Easter. The actual area of the “Wet Room” taken up by the kitchen facilities will be slightly more than at present, but will not significantly restrict the use of the room.

However, it is important that ALL members respect the need for the kitchen to be kept clean and tidy, not least of all for reasons of health and safety, so access to the kitchen area will be restricted to those using the cooking and related facilities. Inappropriate use of the area, such as sitting on the work surfaces, will NOT be treated as harmless fun, and may result in sanctions being applied to offending members.

Club members who have already gained their Level 2 Powerboat Certificate are taking part in a Safety Boat course over the weekend of 15/16th February. This will increase the level of competence in our Club to properly ensure the safety of sailors afloat – both our members and visitors taking part in our open events.
