## SUDDENLY IT'S SUMMER!

Three weeks of sunny days, blue skies, sails on Sutton Creek – summer arrived early this year, and many of our sailors have been making the most of it before the rain returned at the end of May – Club sailing is in full swing.

The Club Handbook which accompanies this edition of "KNOTS" incorporates the full schedule of sailing for the season. If every race is held on schedule, by the end of the year you could have competed in 115 races on 44 separate dates – you certainly have enough choice! Racing for all at **10.30 every Sunday morning**, and **7.30 every Wednesday evening**, with "adults only" sailing on **Monday evenings** for those who want time away from the younger folk.

This Handbook contains all you need to know as a Club member – the names and contact numbers of all Club officials; Club bye-laws and Constitution; calendar of events for every Class sailed in the Club; training course dates; and even the times of high tides for every day of the year (in case you want to go sailing or swimming outside scheduled event times).

## JUNE PLACES STILL AVAILABLE

For our enthusiastic Junior Sailors, the Club sent out application forms for the **ISA Junior Training Courses** some months ago, so you may have assumed that the June course would be fully booked by now. If you're the sort of person who leaves everything to the last minute, you're in luck – there are still places available. The only occasions our sailors will get to compete against “strangers” will be at championships and regattas hosted by other clubs. However, the month of July is our turn to play host, when we open our doors for visitors to enjoy our superb sailing waters, event management, and hospitality!

**Sunday July 4<sup>th</sup> is REGATTA DAY** – this year, the Junior and Senior Regattas will be sailed as one event. Whether you’re a small sailor in an Optimist or a large one in a GP 14 (or anywhere on the line in between!), this is your event! No need to put the boat on a trailer, or book a bed and breakfast – you have no excuse for not competing in your own Regatta! **So put the date in your diary, make sure your crew (if you have one) will be available, and get out Club racing to get some practice – you might even win a prize!**

**Calling all Optimist sailors** – get your boat down to the Club and on the water: this is the year when Optimists take centre stage at Sutton. Boats from all round the country will be coming to compete in the popular **Crosbie Cup on Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> July**. If you’re already at the racing stage, don’t be afraid to compete: you’re just as entitled to take part as some of the visiting “hot-shots”. **This is YOUR Club, so make sure you enjoy the event as much as anyone!** *We’ll need lots of help from non-competing members, both ashore (catering, administration, traffic control, boat parking) and afloat (race management, safety boats, etc.), so be prepared to lend a hand!*
