Remember, we also need your **boat details** to record your racing results during the year – Race Officers note the finishing sail numbers, then try to match the sail number with a boat and its owner!

We're asking every one of you to indicate if there are aspects of the Club activities where **YOU** could help out – **catering, race management, safety boat driving**, etc. The success of our club depends on those who give as well as take – that's how we manage to keep our membership fees down while running a full schedule of sailing and social activities.

Courses will only proceed if sufficient bookings have been received and appropriately qualified instructors are available, so it is important that bookings are submitted within the dates specified. Look at your schedule for the summer (holidays, Irish College, etc.) and see which courses will suit you best – the sooner we know how many will be on each course, the sooner we can book instructors and other staff who make it all possible!

Courses may be booked by payment of a deposit of **€50 per person, non-refundable** (unless a course is cancelled due to lack of numbers), before the deadline of **Friday 27th March 2015**. The balance is payable before **Friday 1st May 2015**. There will be a **limited number of places on each course, which will be reserved according to booking receipt date**. Each applicant must be at least 10 years old (or 9 years old and have successfully completed the SDC "Taste of Sailing" Opi Course), and be a paid up member of Sutton Dinghy Club.

"TASTE OF SAILING" OPI COURSE

A great hit with the younger kids - ages 8 & 9. This fun-filled "Taste of Sailing" Opi Course is for young children who want to try dinghy sailing for the first time and enjoy the fun, the sea and getting comfortable with jumping in and out of dinghies at Sutton Creek. This is designed to allay children's fears of the water, give them a feel for dinghy sailing and encourage them to appreciate the marine environment and life at Sutton Dinghy Club.

YOUTH START SAILING & BASIC SKILLS

Ages: 10 and older (or 9 if successfully completed "Taste of Sailing" Opi course). The aim of these courses is to provide young people with the opportunity to try the sport of dinghy sailing in a friendly, fun-filled and safe environment. It is our mission to infuse our novices with such a love of the sport that they want to keep coming back for more. We provide all necessary equipment including buoyancy aids and full length wetsuits for these starter courses.

ADULT TASTE OF SAILING SESSIONS

The aim of these 3 hour introductory courses is to give a positive introduction to the thrills of dinghy sailing at Sutton Dinghy Club. No prior experience or knowledge is required, wet suits and buoyancy aids supplied.

ADULT START SAILING COURSE - Level 1

The aim of these courses is to provide a hands-on introduction to dinghy sailing for beginners. By the end of the course participants will have had an exciting introduction to the sport of sailing, including basic boat handling techniques and essential background knowledge.

BASIC SKILLS LEVEL 2

By the end of this course the successful sailor will be safety conscious, have a basic knowledge of sailing and be capable of sailing on their own without an instructor in light winds.

ACCESSIBLE SAILING IN SUTTON

In 2015, SDC hope to expand sessions to facilitate accessible sailing in Sutton in partnership with **Accessibility Ireland**. Last year, the Service Users from the Rehabilitative Training Unit of the **Central Remedial Clinic** (CRC) went on their fourth annual "taste of sailing" evening in June, with the support of SDC junior and senior members. To ensure the guests had a safe and pleasant evening, the team led by Junior Affairs Officer **Mandy Kelly** assessed and allocated jobs and activities for all guests appropriately. The Club chartered in wheelchair-accessible boats from Disability Ireland to accommodate wheelchair users.

The weather was warm and sunny when the CRC visitors arrived, were greeted by Club members and given a briefing on the plan for the evening. Some pushed out their boundaries in new directions to enjoy the thrills and spills of dinghy sailing, some also got to experience power boating in SDC Rescue Boats. This was followed by a BBQ which all enjoyed.

Feedback from CRC visitors' experience:

Amanda Farrell, a wheelchair user, said she was amazed she could be safely transferred on to a boat and sailed down the Creek in the company of a Club member. She considered it a great experience - would like to go again!

Stephanie Geoghegan, a wheelchair user, was hoisted carefully into an accessible boat. "At first I was petrified thinking I couldn't do it then **Saoirse**, one of the Club's juniors, chatted to me and we went for a great sail."

Conor Sheridan said "I had a great time on the speed boat - can we do it again?"

Conor Hughes added "if my Ma and Da could see me, now they wouldn't believe I can sail a boat!"

To date, Sutton Dinghy Club has hosted sessions for the **Rehabilitative Training Unit, Clontarf Day Centre** and **Transition Programme** in CRC; **Malahide Special Olympics** football team; and a summer project from **St. Michael's House**, all co-ordinated by Mandy and a good team of Club members and Community Employment Staff.

SIGN UP A FRIEND – AND SAVE!

For our Club to remain viable, it needs to maintain a level of membership which guarantees that it will remain financially "afloat" – this means providing enough social and recreational enjoyment to keep many members renewing each year, and attracting new people to consider taking up membership.
